Process

As we currently only have three Obis in our loan library, if you are wishing to request an Obi Feeding Device for your client, please contact MND Vic Equipment Service (ph. 03 9830 2122) to investigate if an Obi is available for loan. Please note:

- Prioritisation and allocation of equipment requests Equipment requests are prioritised according to urgency which is determined on advice from the requesting AHP and MND Advisor.
- The Obi Feeding Device will be sent to the Health Professional and not directly to the client. It is important for the Health Professional to set up and educate the client, and carers on the use, and care of the Obi Feeding Device
- 3. Instruction in use of equipment

Instruction in the use of the equipment is the responsibility of the requesting AHP. It is expected that this will be arranged at the time the equipment is prescribed and completed at the time of delivery. Where the requesting AHP has arranged for a local AHP to provide training – please provide all contact details in the online Equipment Request Form so all associated AHP's can be advised when dispatch is arranged.

4. Clients moving to Residential Aged Care Facilities (RACF) Clients moving into a Commonwealth Government funded or privately funded Residential Aged Care Facility (RACF) may take some equipment they currently have with them. However, this does not include the Obi Feeding Device. This must be returned to MNDV prior to relocating into a RACF. For equipment required to be provided by a RACF under the Aged Care Act 1997 see Part 3 section 3.1 - 3.6. Further information can be found also in the Quality-of-Care Principles 2014.
